Much of this was in the Monday news yesterday but here are a few band notes for the next few weeks:

Concert Instrument Checkout:

School owned concert instruments may be checked out from 3pm-5pm on July 25th.

DCI in the Heartland @ Mustang High School:

We are excited to host a Drum Corp International Tour stop for 7 "professional" marching bands. If you have seen any of these before, you know how exciting these shows can be! If you are new to the activity, consider checking this out! You will be amazed at what can happen on a football field.

Drum Corp International controls the gates and the ticketing for this event. There will be many places to volunteer that will get you in the gate for free in the coming weeks. Watch your Monday News emails and info from Joanne Keeter for further information.

Fireworks:

We need both student and adult volunteers to make our fireworks stand run. The Band Booster Organization kicks in over \$50,000 to keep our band fees as low as possible. This is one of the primary fundraisers that make this contribution possible. The fireworks stands are great places to get to know the rest of our band family and are honestly pretty fun to work.

Travel to Indy:

At this point, we still do not have our housing assignment from Bands of America. We will absolutely let you know as soon as we have our housing assignment.

We still need several trip chaperones for the trip to Indy as well. This is a GREAT way to travel with the band! A chaperone trip could be outlined as follows:

- Travel with the Band- Busses/Rehearsal Stops Etc.
- Guarantee a spot in the same hotel as the band. (2 parents per room)
- Eat with the Band- All meal accommodations for chaperones are catered with the band.
- All Tickets to BOA Events and any other events are included.
- Potential to go on the field with the kids! Likely pushing or carrying something.:-)
- Accountability- Role call on buses, room checks in hotels and serving as a point of contact on the trip for about 8-10 kids.
- There will be a chaperone meeting the week before we travel to help clarify everything.
- Group pricing helps the parents too!

We have chaperone contracts on hand tonight outlining dates and travel costs. Contracts will be taken on a first come first served basis. The first payment is not due until August. Once we receive your contract, we will respond and confirm.

Nightrider Invitational:

Looks like we will have 18 bands for NRI this year. Most are 6a with a few 5a schools sprinkled in. It should round out to be a great day!



Show Update:

Music is complete for \(^3\)4 of the show and drill is complete to the first \(^1\)2. The professionalism and creative vision of our design team is really incredible.

Our props are 6ft twin ladders painted bright yellow. 64 of them. We ordered one a while back and Doug painted it for us. We have ordered 65 that should be in at the end of July so we will be able to work with our props as intended in August.

The custom uniforms have all been ordered and should arrive around the first week of September. We will use the traditional and the custom uniform this fall. The traditional uniform will be worn toward the beginning and switching gears into the new top as we get into contest season.

Uniform Fitting Plan:


We are working to plan uniform fittings the week of DCI, beginning Monday July 23rd. If all goes according to plan, students will receive all of their shirts, gloves, compression gear and new member items at that time also. The only items that will come in a little late will be their uniform shoes.

Firefighter Bean Supper:

We have an opportunity to put a booth at the Fire Departments community event. We cannot sell food of any nature, but we can sell Mustang Gear or maybe items that would help keep people cool, or perhaps both. I know we can make cooling bandanas fairly inexpensively or we could look into making a bulk purchase on something online and then just re-sell it. I found them earlier today for \$1.99 if we order at least 100. I think we would see way more than that. Estimated attendance is 4000+.
